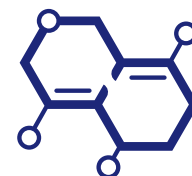

Supporting people affected by cancer

No one should go through cancer alone.

CCQ offers a wide range of cancer support services to assist patients and their families. In 2020, we provided thousands of people in the Far North Queensland region with support.



1925 nights of accommodation were provided in our Marylyn Mayo Lodge in Cairns.



558 contacts were made with 13 11 20, providing support to those impacted by cancer.



37 people referred to our Cancer Counselling Service.



\$8,980 of financial assistance provided through Cancer Council services, **supporting 45 patients**.



80 wigs and turbans were provided to Queenslanders who experienced hair loss as a result of cancer treatment.



49,059 kilometers driven by volunteers as part of our Transport to Treatment service.

\$21.6M raised throughout fundraising activities in Queensland

1100 registered volunteers in Queensland helped carry out our vision of a cancer free future in 2020, in addition to the thousands of community members volunteering and fundraising at events.
